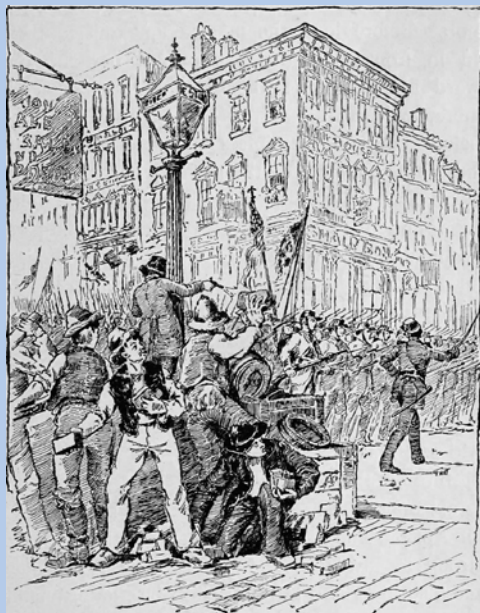

THE PREMISE

When the revolution comes, the richest person in town will be the first one up against the wall. After that happens, the second richest person in town will walk away from the seething mob safe, sound, and wealthy enough to retire.

In *First Against the Wall* you win if you have accumulated the second most personal wealth when society runs out of Restraint. It's a twenty minute action selection game where you want to be wealthy, but not TOO wealthy.
